

Title	Bridging Faith and Science: Genesis Outreach Activities of Hong Kong Creation Resources Ministry
Topic/Field	Biblical creation education
Target audience	General
<p>The Hong Kong Creation Resources Ministry (HKCRM), in partnership with Iaganack Productions, has been actively involved in outreach activities since 2013. Iaganack Productions focuses on translating English creation books and videos into Chinese and other Asian languages. HKCRM regularly organizes four main events: geotours, museum creation walks, school education programs, and creation book clubs. These events aim to enhance biblical and scientific understanding among different age groups in both church and school communities. HKCRM also conducts effective Biblical Creation seminar series for church adult Sunday School classes, one-off speaking engagements at church services, Youth Group meetings, large-scale school assemblies, smaller classroom sessions, and public lectures at Book Fairs. Additionally, several online seminar series have been effective in equipping believers for apologetics outreach.</p> <p>School Education Activities Program</p> <p>The School Education Activities Program aims to deepen students' exploration of the Bible and science. HKCRM organizes a series of educational activities that allow teachers and students to explore the world from the perspective of biblical creation. This program offers extracurricular activities outside of regular classes, encouraging teachers to think creatively and design tailor-made activities for their students. These activities include creation talks, STEM workshops, book clubs, geology excursions, and birdwatching.</p> <p>Creation Book Clubs</p> <p>The "Creation Book Club" leverages publications by Iaganack Productions. An article is selected, and reading guidance along with stimulating questions are provided in advance for each session. During the book club meetings, readers are encouraged to express their opinions and share their discoveries. This interactive approach fosters a more engaging learning environment and cultivates readers' attitudes toward pursuing the truth. The discussions spark curiosity and critical thinking, inviting participants to reflect on the relationship between their beliefs and the real world.</p> <p>The Challenge of School Education Activities Program</p> <p>The challenge we face is finding ways to teach that motivate students to learn. Nowadays, all students in Hong Kong are taught using activity-based learning methods. We need to involve activities to motivate their learning. Some of our creation talks have been reformatted into a question-answer format. Students are encouraged to raise their hands to answer questions. In return, small gifts, such as magazines, are given as souvenirs. Sometimes, during the Q&A session, their questions can be challenging to answer. This is encouraged as it shows they are thinking. Supplementary answers can usually be given after the session.</p> <p>The Challenge of Creation Book Clubs</p> <p>The challenge we face is tailoring the book club to meet unusual requests from schools, such as helping non-Chinese students learn more Chinese. One book club discusses the similarities of different legends of a global flood in various countries. We arrange games like the 'Telephone game', where players form a line or circle, and the first player whispers a Chinese message in English to the next</p>	

person. This continues until the last player announces the message they think they heard in Chinese. The game demonstrates how changes can occur from the original message due to miscommunication. It also helps them learn some Chinese during the book club.
